On the way to Buckingham Palace we saw the Queen's guards on horses.






We walked to Buckingham Palace to take photos.





We visited the British Museum and we saw pharaos, sphinx...






Day 4: Tower of London and Saint Paul's cathedral



For dinner, we ate pizza, chips, hamburgers, pasta bolognese... We ate the food and we liked it.


The food was copious.
